· Last Year's State Shoot meeting minutes were read by Roger Kershaw. **Motion** to approve was made and seconded.

· *Treasurer's Report:* by Treasurer, read by Parsons Metzkw. Parsons reported that the FSCA financially supported the State Championship event this year with \$2,000 for trophies, \$1,000 of gift giveaways, paid for the banquet dinner and paid for youths to shoot free at the event. There is \$15,000 remaining in the FSCA budget. **Motion** to approve was made and seconded.

· *Report of Committees:* There are no active committees at this time. However a nominating committee for next term officers starting January 2010 is underway. Replacements for Jerry and Parsons are being solicited. The nominating committee will be staffed by Roger, Debbie, Parsons and Toby.

· *President's Report*

Jerry Seaman reported that there were 241 shooters in the main event this year which is slightly lower than the 263 shooting that event in 2008.

Our president thanked Pat Welch and all his staff and volunteers for hosting this tournament. The membership and attendees gave them all a rousing applause. Bradford Farms has become one the premier shooting grounds in the country and they do a great job. There was a long list of vendors Jerry thanked as well for their tremendous support. Appreciation also went to the Univ. of Florida trappers who again did a fantastic job on all the venues.

Jerry reminded the assembly that their target setters (Kirk, Pat, Dwayne and Gary) put tremendous effort into this championship event and that the FSCA had NOTHING to do with the level of difficulty on the FITASC or 5 stand events. Honest.

Not to forget the work that Debbie Wall did on our behalf, Jerry thanked her for selection of the awards and rounding up give-away prizes that were handed out before the banquet Saturday night.

Jerry reminded everyone that there is a spectacular shrimp dinner following the main event completion on Sunday. The FSCA hopes everyone stays around for the shoot offs and awards then enjoys the dinner.

The assembly was happy to hear from Pat Garrett that new sporting clays facility will be opening soon near Tampa. The range is called Fishhawk Clays and can be seen on the web at www.fishhawkclays.com. New owner is Wayne Evans.

Unfinished Business: The award for the 2010 FL State Shoot has been given to Quail Creek just this past week. Congratulations on a winning bid, even though there were very few bids.
